

Fundamentals of Engineering Exam

What is the FE exam?

- The FE exam is the first step in professional registration. It is a comprehensive, national exam that students normally take during their senior year. Mining and Geological Engineering majors take the general version of the exam, which covers statics, strength of materials, dynamics, fluid dynamics, thermodynamics, electrical circuits, economics, and other engineering and engineering science topics. The exam is usually offered twice each year. Review sessions are offered through Tau Beta Pi honorary society. The exam cost is \$30 to register and \$125 for the exam. All mining engineering seniors are advised to take the FE exam as part of their senior design course.

How to register?

- Pick up an application in Engineering 200 (Academic Affairs Office) or download the form from the [Arizona Board of Registration website](#) (Applications link, then “In training/Forms” link)
- Have the application form notarized (there is a notary public in the Dean’s office in Civil Engineering 100)
- Once your application has been accepted you will be notified and then you can register for the actual exam online through the NCEES website (National Council of Examiners for Engineering and Surveying) www.ncees.org (click on the AZ link and download the registration form)
